It's beginning to feel a lot like Autumn in Cumbria. As the seasons change, we know thoughts will be turning to nights of knitting and wearing wool for walks so we wanted to share news of a few of our current creations as well as an exhibition coming up at Rheged that we think you'll love.

First, some autumnal colour and inspiration.







The detail of <u>Debbie Lucas</u>'s eco-printed wool stole is probably one of the most Autumnal items in the Caldbeck shop at the moment. There's a range of Debbie's work for sale at present, from framed images to needle cases as she aims to use every last scrap of her beautiful fabrics.

<u>Tracey Todhunter</u>'s crocheted clothing and kits are popular buys and she made this granny square bunting for the shop over the summer. It's a great example of how a traditional technique, with an added eye for colour combinations, can make something a bit different.

The final picture shows a small selection of woven textures in the current range of scarves from Jan Beadle. Anyone who follows Jan on social media will know that colour is key for her too and there are plenty of Autumnal shades and tones in her current shop display.







We've plenty of gift ideas in the shop too and these three seem nicely representative. First, a knitting kit for a Swirly Hat, created by <u>Alice</u> <u>Underwood</u> using Shetland wool. There are two colourways, a green plus marl and a russet plus marl, named Spring and Autumn.

As well as kits, we've unusual notions and tools such as these stitch markers. <u>Jean Wildish</u> makes these using glass beads or sea glass so each set is unique.

And, for the beer drinker who has everything, <u>Chloe Randall's</u> beer mitten would make a great gift - it has definitely been making customers at The Wool Clip smile over the summer.
